The Communication Arts program uses an Education Option ("Ed Opt") admissions method: 16% above grade level readers, 68% are on grade level, 16% are below grade; applicants without NYS test scores are all assigned to the "On Grade Level" pool. Murrow ranks applicants based on Attendance 20%, Lateness 30%, final 7th Grade report card for English, Math, Science, Social Studies 30%, ELA Test Score 10%, Math Test Score 10%; for applicants without NYS test scores, the 7th grade subject area grades will be used in place of test scores. NYS test scores are not used for admissions to the vocal music program, the instrumental music program, or the fine and visual arts program. The studio theater program selects students based on attendance, punctuality, course grades, NYS test scores, and audition; for applicants without NYS test scores, the 7th grade subject area grades will be used in place of test scores. The most important piece of any admissions consideration is a child's absences and latenesses.
