For students without any scores, the State test score component will be eliminated from the evaluation and all other criteria will be increased proportionally. Students without 5th grade State test scores must either score in the 90th percentile on one of the following national exams: ERB Comprehensive Testing Program 4, TerraNova, Stanford Achievement Test, Comprehensive Testing Program (CTP 4), or Iowa Test of Basic Skills (ITBS) OR, in the absence of scores on any of the above listed exams, the principal of the applicant's current school must submit a letter to HCHS Admissions confirming the absence of scores from any acceptable exam listed above and attesting to the student's academic readiness for the HCHS exam; in the latter case, a qualifying exam will be administered at the Hunter College Campus Schools in December. There is a \$90 fee to take the qualifying exam which must be covered by the family and made payable on the day of the exam. The results of the qualifying exam will determine if the student is eligible to sit for the HCHS Entrance Exam in January. School Website

If you only have one of the tests, that score will count for 5% of the weight and the other 5% will be shifted to core class grades. Students without test grades are not penalized.
